## 1. The 9<sup>th</sup> Civil Engineering Conference in the Asian Region (CECAR9) and 43<sup>rd</sup> Executive Committee Meeting Hosted by ICE, India, September 20-23, 2022

The 43<sup>rd</sup> ECM meetings and CECAR 9 conference in Goa, India last month were successful. We conducted the TCCM, FLC, PCM, and ECM all into a long day, while CECAR 9 went smoothly over the following 3 days. While both events were conducted primarily in person, ICE(I) was able to make them flexible for a few participants (less than 20%) so they could join us virtually. This was the first CECAR conducted in a hybrid mode.

In addition to the normal items discussed at the ECM meetings, several new items were approved. An ACECC Code of Ethics was approved as a guidance document for implementation by respective member societies, thanks to TC-17. The Guidance and Terms of Reference document for technical committees was updated with a few significant changes, including period of performance for TCs. A new technical committee, TC- 30 "Digital Technologies for Smart Construction", was approved with Dr. Sung-min Cho of KSCE as the TC Chair.

At these meetings we reviewed progress made on implementation of ACECC's strategic plan. We discussed potential new members, especially Institution of Engineers Sri Lanka and Society of Engineers United Arab Emirates, who have shown some initial interest in ACECC. Future Leaders Forum (FLF) activities are going strong and we encouraged the installation of an ACECC award under the FLF category. Preliminary plans were discussed for the 44<sup>th</sup> ECM at Jeju, S. Korea in April 2023, and it was decided that CICHE will host the 45<sup>th</sup> ECM in Taipei, Taiwan in September 2023.

Despite many challenges, primarily emanating from the coronavirus pandemic, CECAR 9 went very well. A few members and speakers could not attend due to travel issues, but many of them were able to participate virtually (live video). Plenary sessions, with keynote speeches by eminent dignitaries from India and abroad, were very well attended. Technical sessions were conducted in seven concurrent tracks during the first 2 days of CECAR 9. Papers presented were of high quality. I went from session to session and found all of them well attended. The Awards ceremony was conducted beautifully by the Awards Sub-committee Chair (Prof. Luh Man Chang). Also, ICE(I) organized the evening social functions during the ECM and CECAR 9 perfectly. The beautiful location, nice hotel facilities, great food, and warm hospitality of the hosts added to the enjoyment of all in-person attendees. We appreciate the efforts of Prof. Piplani and his team from ICE(I) in making CECAR 9 very successful, and thank the participants, especially from outside India, who also played a major role in it.

CECAR 9 ended with handing of the ACECC flag from ICE(I) to KSCE. So the next CECAR (CECAR 10) will be held in Jeju, S. Korea in October 21-24, 2025. Also, the leadership of the ECM, PCM, and TCCM transitioned from ICE(I) to KSCE. My thanks to Prof. Vasan, Dr. Sharma, Dr. Ghai, and Prof. Piplani for their leadership on various ACECC activities during the last 3 years. I am looking forward to working with Prof. Jae-Woo Park and his KSCE team over the next 3 years.
